

## Plans for Shuttle Service Progressing

Our dream to purchase a handicapped-accessible van to benefit our residents will soon be a reality. Earlier this year, we told you of our plans to make this purchase as soon as possible. We launched a campaign in late winter to raise the necessary funds.

We are very excited to announce that a generous donor came forward with a challenge to our Board of Directors. If the Board raises \$15,000, our donor will match their combined gift with two dollars for every one raised by its members. In total, we could have \$45,000 through this effort alone. Our donor for this project wishes to remain anonymous.

This van will allow our assisted living residents to remain active and connected to the greater community. In offering this new service, our residents can leave campus for appointments, errands, shopping or visits with friends and family.

Thank you to everyone who responded with a gift to our recent appeal. Our goal of \$60,000 will cover the purchase of the van, insurance and maintenance costs.

## Welcoming New Residents on Campus

We are blessed to have new residents joining us on campus as they move into the recently renovated Jordan Hall.

Fifteen apartments were made available earlier this spring. Providing new options in assisted living on our campus, these units range in size and cost, but include studio apartments, as well as one- to two-bedroom units. We currently have 11 of the 15 units rented. The four units that remain are studio apartments.

Between Tivoli Terrace, and now Jordan Hall, St. Anne's has 39 assisted living units on campus. Private apartments within a supportive community make for an ideal situation. Staying independent is key to the assisted living program. Residents have privacy when they need it and community when they want it. Another benefit of residing on campus is our continuum of care from assisted living to licensed Medicare and Medicaid certified skilled nursing.

All of our residents benefit from a faith-based environment, including daily Mass in our chapel. We provide pastoral care, regularly scheduled activities, an exceptional dietary program and on-site health care services. Residents also enjoy the benefit of a beautiful and secure campus. Soon they will also have a shuttle service on campus that will enable them to stay connected to the greater community.
